- 10. Consider each pile in order and arrange in sequence by pasting up on a piece of paper. Sequence should be designed to include useful information and leave out non-pertinent material at that point.
- 11. When all material is pasted up, a typist participating in the group should type it up quickly. The typist should be free to add or change material as they go so that the work will proceed more quickly and yet still be subject to group conscienceness after typing.
- 12. Note: While the group discussion of the topic outline is important. the procedure of clipping and pasting is mechanical and too much discussion at this point will goof up the process because no lasting change can be effected.
